

CALL FOR NOMINATION OF TRUSTEES

Letsatsi Borutho Community Trust

The Letsatsi Borutho Trust, which owns an **4% share in Droogfontein Solar Power**, was established with the objective of carrying out public benefit activities in the local community, within the Frances Baard District.

The Trust seeks to establish its governance structure by **appointing TWO Beneficiary Trustees**. Nominations are sought from all sectors of the community.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The Letsatsi Borutho Community Trust now calls for nominations of TWO suitable candidates from the Frances Baard District community to be appointed as trustees for a 3-year term of office.

- Candidates must be nominated by a member of a beneficiary community and the nomination must be supported by at least twenty other beneficiary community members.
- The nomination should include a letter of motivation along with the curriculum vitae of the nominated candidate, as well as the names, contact details, and signatures of at least twenty beneficiary community members that support the nomination of the candidate.

- The letter of motivation should include a confirmation that the nominated candidate has accepted the nomination.
- Candidates may not nominate themselves

Criteria

To avoid conflict of interest in the decision making process of the Trust, nominated candidates should not have any immediate association with an individual or organisation that will directly benefit from the Trust by applying to the Trust for support.

Candidates must:

- Be in good standing in their professional fields and in the community;
- Have a broad perspective of the developmental needs of the Frances Baard District community and not represent the interests of only one part of the community or the interests of one development sector;
- Have strong networks in diverse sectors of the community;
- Have a demonstrated track record of leadership in the community;
- Be able to dedicate a substantial amount of time to the governance of the Trust on a voluntary basis;
- Be resident in the Frances Baard District area; and
- Offer the possibility, through their involvement as trustees, of ensuring the efficient, effective, transparent, and credible operation of the Trust.
- Black women candidates are especially encouraged.

Nominated candidates may not:

- Be affiliated / representative / an official of a political party, or an employee of a provincial department or local municipality.
- Have a criminal record, have been liquidated or sequestered in the last 10 years.

The Competencies and Character of the Board of Trustees

In making final decisions about the candidates to be appointed as beneficiary trustees, the Trust will ensure that the board of trustees, has a good mix of financial, legal, strategic, and community development competencies; and broadly reflects the diversity of interests in the community.

Closing Date & Interviews

Nominations will be accepted up until **13th March 2015** and not thereafter. Nominated candidates must be available for interviews, which will take place during the 1st and 2nd week April 2015. The choice of trustees appointed will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
